The Best Kept Secret

What is it about a woman born in 1718 that has the power to ignite a flame within the hearts of so many people in the twenty first century? Nano was a woman in tune with the political and social conditions of her time and its effect on people. In the eighteenth century if a girl was to be educated at all it was primarily as a decorative companion for her husband - music, painting and dancing were what mattered. Nano broke this mould. The life of this amazing woman has great significance for us today, not so much by **what** she achieved in a hostile environment - but **how** she achieved it. She was sensitive to those things that were 'not fair' and certainly prepared to 'walk the talk'.

Nano didn't wait until she had a grand plan and the money to finance it. She made a start by stepping outside into her own community, doing what she could, and allowing her ministry to develop. She recognised that education was the key to enable the poor to break the cycle of poverty and raise their status in society. She didn't allow disappointments and setbacks to prevent her moving forward and was prepared to take calculated risks.

Nano networked with people and encouraged others to collaborate with her at a time when what she was doing was illegal. She worked out a way to give permanence to what she had started and worked tirelessly to achieve it. Nano was prepared to challenge and hold out against Church and civil authority. Everything Nano did was underpinned by her relationship with a loving God.

Nano spent only the last nine years of her life as a religious, the bulk of her ministry was accomplished as a lay woman. The **way** Nano went about her ministry could be a blueprint for us as well. On every continent, there are numerous lay men and women, nurtured by the spirit of Nano engaging in ministries large and small. For the most part, these ministries are hidden. The time has surely come when we gather the stories – what a powerful read we would have. I suspect the Friends of Nano may be the best kept secret of the Presentation family.




