

Aiding Alzheimer's

15 years ago, I wanted to host an Alzheimer's coffee break in memory of my mom, who died in 1985. Because I was not in a workplace whereby we could host the regular type "coffee break", with the support of my sister, Mary Holly, we decided to invite people to come and make a donation whereby they would receive a tax receipt from the Alzheimer's Association.

Our first gathering was in our parish hall where we collected a little over \$200. Because it lacked warmth and hospitality, we decided to invite others into our own home. Since that time, we alternate each year, her house or mine, and gather around the first of October. Once September comes, we have friends and neighbours asking "When are you having your Alzheimer's fundraiser?"

What was once coffee and cookies and amounts of \$200, is now potluck and peach trifle and \$1000 in donations. This year we presented \$1015 to the Society. It is usually scheduled from 2 to 4 PM but most people go home at 6 or 7 PM, and I love that. We do not need entertainment, as everyone is too busy talking and sharing stories and catching up on the news. Their dedication and support spurs us on and their giving is so generous and genuine, certainly a blessing.

As you know, Alzheimer's is afflicting more and more people at a much younger age. Many of our earlier guests have long passed away and some afflicted with Alzheimer's are now in nursing homes. It breaks my heart to see this condition claim more and more of those around us and rob them from their family and friends long before their time. I'm so happy we started this little venture and that it's bearing more and more fruit each year.

The Christ: Divine Presence in All Creation





On June 8, 2019, Associates and Sisters from our three Presentation Associate groups – Avondale Ballygriffin, and Nano, together with Sister Ruth, assembled at the Virginia Waters Retreat Centre. Here, our group shared Nano Nagle's charismatic vision, as those in attendance eagerly engaged with our presenter, Sister Dorothy Corrigan.

Sister Dorothy immediately captured our interest, as she introduced our topic, the *Divine Emerging Empowerment* that has been at work since the beginning of time. She referenced the extensive research of scientists, which indicated that this emerging began some 13.8 billion years ago. In our discussion, she noted that during this time period, a Divine presence was active and this Divine presence is called, "The Christ."

Sister Dorothy went on to say that The Great Soul, The Cosmic Christ, pulls and directs creation forward to its end points, this being the greater unification and spiritualization of the universe. During the presentation and discussion, she took time to address how Christ is necessary for the whole of creation, and how Jesus is necessary for the individual soul.

Throughout the session, the presenter invited participants to take time for reflection, prayer, and stillness, and share thoughts on three key questions:

- Who made you?
- Who is God?
- Why did God make you?

As the retreat concluded, we felt grateful for each other, for God in us, for the opportunity to be part of the Presentation's Movement and the positive energy that we felt was surrounding us. 
