





Our Associate Journey

The welcoming process to become Presentation Associates that we (Frank and Patty) followed back in 2000 was called 'journeying in faith' . In January of that year, Sr. Sharon Fagan, director of Presentation Associates, invited us on that journey. During the following months, we looked at an historical sketch of the Presentation Congregation - learning that it was established by Nano Nagle in Cork Ireland in 1776. The charism she bequeathed her followers, a charism of compassion and justice, was rooted in the pressing needs of her day -the education and religious instruction of the children of Ireland who were deprived of those rights under the penal laws. In our learning, we were inspired by the courage and vision, not only of Nano, but of the first four sisters who came to Newfoundland in August of 1833 - Mother Kirwan, and Srs, O'Shaunessy, Maloney, and Lynch. We were also inspired by the commitment and faithfulness of the Presentation Sisters of today who dedicate themselves to those same values.

In the intervening years, we have found that the welcoming and visionary spirituality of the Presentations has helped both of us to balance the

workaholic culture of our times. For the legal profession, access to justice for everyone regardless of means is an ongoing challenge. And, of course, the prevailing church culture is not amenable to equality of persons. And so, both of us have tried to some degree to live counter culturally in our respective professions and lives. Since becoming associates, we've walked the Camino de Santiago in Spain, and learned

anew how to appreciate and care for our wonderful earth. Frank has been instrumental in easing the way for many refugees in our province, along with doing 'pro bono' work for the marginalized of our city. Patty is a member of the JPIC committee (Justice, Peace, and the Integrity of Creation) a group that is motivated by IPA (International Presentation Association), whose mandate is to address the root causes of poverty and confront the personal and corporate greed which exploits our earth. Over the past several years, the Basilica choir has listened to stories of our sisters who work among the poorest of the poor. By connecting the Sunday readings to the work of justice, the choir has been encouraged to collect and donate funds for the work of the Sisters in such countries as Zimbabwe, Kenya, Haiti, and Dominica, and for impoverished young adults in our own city through Streetreach. And finally, as we participated in Presentation chapters, assemblies, and meetings over the years, we have become more and more aware of the 'new story' of our cosmos, and consider ourselves fortunate that we are members of this spirit-filled association of sisters and lay men and women.



A Gratifying Experience - The Host Community

As a member of a host community for our Presentation Associates, it gives me great pride and hope as I experience the growth of this graced initiative taken by our Congregation several years ago.

In her letter to us in October of 2009, Sister Sharon challenged us to pray that our efforts to improve the Associate Relationship would "foster respect and mutuality in a manner that enhances, supports and challenges both associates and vowed members to live more fully Christian values and the spirit of Nano Nagle in their respective life situations". In our Chapter of 2011, we gave life and vision to these words as we affirmed our support and endorsed the Associate Relationship as an essential value for our Congregation.

As we continue our journey with these

wonderful Associates in Corner Brook, and prepare to welcome our four new people, Kay and I are encouraged and excited about how far the Associate Relationship has come and grateful for all we have learned thus far in the journey.
