Associate Leaders Gather Virtually in the USA

It is evolving and all over the world, women and men are carrying the mission and vision of Nano with great zeal and enthusiasm. In Pakistan also the Friends of





Nano are carrying the mission of Nano. We visit the needy and reach out to the ones in need. Our enthusiastic members throughout the country are serving and carrying the flame of Nano but, due to pandemic COVID-19 that everyone is suffering throughout the world, sadly we couldn't continue our work. When the situation is improving we will continue the mission of Nano and will share the passion for the poor again and will work on the SDGs.

In February 2020, in the village of Josephabad where people are facing a lot of problems, a short survey and visit was done and SDGs were discussed. People shared the problems they are facing. The young people were encouraged to

clean the village. We are hoping to work with them in future regarding the problems they are facing (especially the Carol Sohail Bhatti lack of clean water).

A story of gratitude from North India

As a young man, studying at Delhi University, I first met Mithlesh Jha whom we addressed as 'Bhel-puri Bhaiya', showing our respect for him and the Bhel-puri (a tangy, spicy sayoury snack made with puffed rice) which he served with warmth and an ever-smiling countenance. Though his stall was in a corner, it was popular among students. He knew us all and when we had spent our allowance but needed food!





This year, accompanying my Mother for her Cancer treatment, imagine my amazement at seeing him outside the gates selling Bhel-puri. After identifying him under his facial mask of Covid times, I discovered he was unemployed (since lockdown) and savings spent. Hunger and the plight of his family compelled him to come out in such testing times. I bought a plate of Bhel-puri, paying him extra, but couldn't forget his plight. Anxious to do something, I contacted my college friends on WhatsApp. Most were shocked and expressed sympathy, but one, who is associated with an NGO, knew what to do. Using Facebook we spread the word throughout the University community and within two days had collected Rs. 2 lakhs. By each contributing a small amount we had been able to help someone in need.

Playing a minor role in providing succor, I have peace of mind and an increased belief in the power of gratitude. May God and Ven. Nano Nagle continue guiding the Friends of Nano in making this world a better place.
